In today's gospel we hear Jesus calling Peter, Andrew, James and John to follow him. Following Jesus was a difficult journey for these first disciples. It is difficult for us today. Did you know that our Parish has a subscription to Formed? It is a website that offers Catholic movies, children's programming, audio dramas and books. search for our parish by zip code: 65240. This is funded by the Fr James Offutt Foundation.

The month of January is dedicated to the **Holy Name of Jesus**, which is celebrated on January 3. The first ten days of January fall during the liturgical season known as **Christmas** which is represented by the liturgical color white the color of light, a symbol of joy, purity and innocence (absolute or restored). The remaining days of January are the beginning of **Ordinary Time**, which is represented by the liturgical color green. This symbol of hope is the color of the sprouting seed and arouses in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection. It is used in the offices and Masses of Ordinary Time.



We would really like to bring back the **liturgy of the word for children** program during 10am Mass. This is a program where kids age 3/4 through 2nd grade can go to the basement for the liturgy of the word portion of Mass and learn about the readings and Gospel on a kid-friendly level. They return for the second half of Mass. To be able to bring this program back, we need volunteers to help teach! Hopefully it would be a once every 6weeks/2 month

Key Pad Lock instructions – Enter the 4 digit code (contact the office if you need the code), you'll hear a faint, very short buzz. This connects the front "deadbolt" handle to the internal parts. You can rotate the deadbolt handle, to unlock the door. Once inside you can lock yourself in or not, your choice. The inside deadbolt handle, is ALWAYS connected, no code required. Once you leave, please reenter the code and the exterior deadbolt handle is connected, allowing you to manually lock the door.

ONLINE GIVING is another way to make your Sunday Offerings to Holy Spirit Parish. Start by going to Holy Spirit website <https://holyspiritcentralmo.org> Go to the toolbar which is about ¼ of the way down the page click on GIVE. This takes you to the opening page of the payment portal. At this point you can create an account by clicking on create account. Or you can make a onetime payment by clicking on pay now. Then just follow the steps. When you set up an account you will need to create a user name and password. Just follow the steps. If you set up an account you have the ability to set up recurring contributions. If you elect to use the recurring it is an automatic donation to the church based on the date and amount you want to give. You can also change the amount, date, etc at any time by just logging back in to your account, by using your username and password and login. You also have the ability to run reports showing your donation history. This is easiest way to use this portal. *You can continue to use your weekly envelopes if you desire, that is not going away. This is just another way of making your contribution.*
